Be a Warming Center

Extreme cold can affect everyone, but can be especially dangerous to small children, the elderly and the chronically ill. Warming centers provide a warm, safe place for people to go during cold weather.

A warming center is a short-term emergency accommodation that operates when temperatures or a combination of precipitation, wind chill, wind and temperature become dangerously inclement. Their purpose is vital to the prevention of death and injury from exposure to the elements.

- Whether transportation to the agency/facility is provided by the agency/facility
